Roswell's Symbols of Selfless Courage



Courage in Action

On September 11, 2001, as flames and smoke consumed the South Tower of the World Trade Center, a 24-year-old equities trader named Welles Crowther made a decision that defined his life—and his legacy. Crowther, a former volunteer firefighter, grabbed a red bandana from his pocket, tied it over his face, and charged up and down the stairs of the 78th floor—again and again—guiding strangers to safety. Survivors later recalled the calmness in his voice, the steadiness of his hands, and the red bandana that became a symbol of hope amid chaos. He saved at least a dozen lives before the tower collapsed. Welles Crowther didn't set out to be a hero that morning. He simply answered a call—to serve, to protect, to give of himself without hesitation. His story reminds us that true heroism is often quiet, instinctive, and rooted in love for others.

That same spirit of courage and selflessness lives among us here in Roswell. When a call comes in—whether it's a structure fire, a car accident, or a dangerous domestic situation—our police officers and firefighters don't stop to calculate risk -They go! Every day, Roswell's Police and Fire face uncertainty and danger with the same resolve that guided Welles Crowther up those smoke-filled stairs. And while their acts of heroism may not make the evening news, they make all the difference to the people whose lives they touch.




